Innovative Approaches to Preschool Literacy

As early childhood educators, we know how important it is to help young children develop early literacy skills. We know that familiarity with print as a communication tool, interest in stories and poetry, and recognition of the relationship between letters and sounds are essential to being ready to learn to read. There is much we can do to help young children develop essential pre-literacy skills that have little to do with learning the A, B, Cs. Come to this short course to learn about phonemic awareness, an essential element in preschool literacy. You will learn how to work with children's natural tendency to PLAY with sounds and words to strengthen their reading readiness. You will learn correct pronunciation of the 44 basic phonemes in the English language. We will play games that you can use every day with young children to teach sound segmentation, sound stretching, sound matching, and sound substitution. You will leave with a full toolkit that will help you get started on building young children's phonemic awareness, an important pre-cursor to being ready to read.
