The Tlingit Family Learning Centre has been working to address the needs of our community for 15 years. While we serve the whole community we have a focus on the needs of our Aboriginal community. We are fortunate to have dedicated and competent staff with the persistent dedication required to help break the cycles of endemic generational issues that challenge our community. We are grateful for the frequent and substantive acknowledgments we have received for our successes by outside professionals such as the Provincial Head Start Advisor and we see those successes in the lives of our children.

While we have been told by outside professionals that we ought to give presentations on what we have learned. We live in a very isolated northern community and have very little opportunity for interaction with other northern communities and therefore few opportunities to share our successes or to learn from our neighbours. We believe this Leadership Initiative will give us opportunity to network with other northern ECE workers, build confidence and leadership capacity and strengthen our ability to deliver even more effective programming. This is strong motivation for being involved in the Leadership Initiative.

Our plan under this Leadership Initiative will also help us develop community awareness of ECE's important role in supporting healthy child development in our programs. Currently our ECE program includes workshops for parents and we are very engaged with our families encouraging parents to implement effective strategies and lifestyles in the home. We want parents to understand the importance of support for healthy social, emotional and physical development in the early years. As professionals we have developed this understanding and awareness and we have built our knowledge base and skills through ECE training and practice. Conveying our knowledge and experience of the benefits Early Childhood Education requires a deep level of trust. This trust is built over time. It requires relationship built on honesty and our modeling what we teach. This trust comes readily with healthier families and is most challenging where the needs are greatest.

Though isolated we, as an ECE team, are continually building capacity. Motivated by the real needs that confront us we are continually upgrading our skills and building our knowledge base through seminars and workshops, professional journals, internet websites, professional consultants and networking with other professionals in our community. The Leadership Initiative will provide opportunity to promote public confidence in ECE within our community and to reach out and network with other communities in the north that are likely to share many of the same social and community health issues.

In response to the opportunity provided by this Leadership Initiative we have been looking at our strengths and our needs, collaborating with others in our community to develop ideas that will give us the opportunity to share our strengths and learn from others in remote settings like ours.

We wish to play a leadership role by planning and implementing an Annual Children's Festival. This festival will provide knowledge and learning outcomes for all involved. The children will have opportunities to build skills in all areas of development. Adult participants will receive one to one instruction in utilizing the materials and equipment provided.

Atlin, on the shore of beautiful Atlin Lake, is an isolated community which includes the Taku River Tlingit First Nation and peoples of the various other ethnicities. We are a small community with great challenges that impact the health of our children and we are also a community with members who have a huge capacity to care for and nurture the children to help us meet these challenges. Our isolation is determined by our physical location not by our desire to share knowledge with others.

We wish to be a "Community of Leadership Innovation." We can achieve this by will be developing reciprocal relationships with ECE professionals in other surrounding communities.

We will also include provincial officials, school district administrators and teachers and all those with an interest in children and their wellbeing.

We hope to provide financial support where appropriate to assist those coming from other remote communities to ensure that they are able to attend.

We will ensure that indoor venues are available if weather is inclement.

Outcomes we are working to achieve are:

- 1. We anticipate building an effective and mutually beneficial network of relationships with other ECE professionals in our northern region. We wish to create an open dialogue with these communities, obtaining feedback to enhance future festivals.
- 2. Within our community we expect to foster greater understanding of child development, what ECE professionals do to support effective learning and social environments and demonstrate how parents can use what they learn to enhance their home environment. In this way we believe we will generate greater awareness and appreciation of the value of ECE within our community.
- 3. We wish to ignite a passion for healthy children and families within all our hearts that will bring people back to future festivals and thereby sustain our ongoing commitment to learning and growing in our community.





There were also many more children and caregivers from our own community as well!

The children enjoyed activities such as Colour Blending with paint, making c.d. fish, beading bracelets, necklaces and "long snakes". They also enjoyed some sensory integration activities at the Sensory Station. Smells, sounds, and touch were a few of the areas they children had to expand their senses! They smelled spices, fruit extracts and other scents, they felt feathers, fur, plant leaves, and what was that "sticky" stuff in the last box!
