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The Leadership Initiative is about supporting an ECE culture of leadership - so that ECEs have the confidence to take our ways of knowing and doing out the door of our practice to the larger community.

Please share your motivations for being involved in this leadership program.

When looking at this initiative we met with small groups, group centres, preschools and our branch to discover what are the needs of ECE's in our community. We heard loud and clear that we are a "fractured" community we do not work well together we do not communicate well and we need to come together in some way. We also discovered that we are rich in talent and resources that could be shared with colleagues and is at present is only known by a few. We thought this might be a starting point! We feel it is time to celebrate our ECE profession and draw on each other! It is our goal to link the various Early Childhood professionals — and the families through Early Childhood practices.

By showcasing ECEs various leadership skills, talents, and strengths, we hope to achieve a greater awareness of their importance and value in the community.

When choosing our participants to help with this initiative we looked to have some one who was new to the ECE Community being Kim Bowen, Kim graduated in the Spring of 2008.

Our second ECE is Angela Roy, she has worked in the field for many years has worked in many different settings and is now the Aboriginal Preschool Leader in our area and is also the Aboriginal PAL coordinator for our area.

Both of these strong qualified ECE's will be working on this project with our Early Learning Coordinator for our community. Bob Kay is a talented ECE who is excited about this project and who will not only help to bring our vision to life but will also be an excellent male role model for our ECE community and show case men working in a predominately female occupation.

Each Community of Innovation Team will work on a project or initiative that affirms and strengthens ECE leadership in your community. Your idea doesn't have to be all figured out. The Leadership Initiative will help you develop your plan.

Please briefly describe your project. How will it build ECE leadership capacity? How will it help increase public understanding of ECEs work? What community groups will you work with or reach out to? What outcome do you hope for?

Our plan is to create a system which ECE professionals in the described area can list their strengths, skills, talents, and/or specialties. These could include things like – speaking a second language, excellent arts and craft abilities, strength in conducting educational circle times, or even puppetry. Some may be very skilled at working with children who have challenging behaviours, or have exceptional communication skills/experiences. Professionals could list such strengths as story-telling, singing, knowledge of musical instruments or drama. Dance, Yoga, fitness, cooking are all examples of skills or specialties that could be showcased. These would likely be listed on a webpage, accessible by internet, or a catalogue of some type.

If an ECE wanted to provide a special program, or had a circumstance in their childcare setting in which they may not have the skills or experience to deal with, they could then go to the catalogue, and take advantage of the other professionals in the community. For example – if a parent in the program spoke Punjabi, or another language, and this was causing a communication breakdown, the professional could then access the catalogue, find another professional who spoke the language, and that person could interpret or help with the communication.

If an employee wants to provide a fitness program for the children, but needs expertise, they can find someone on the catalogue, and rely on them for information, instruction, or even have them come to the center to provide such a program to the children.

Such a program would build on ECEs leadership and confidence in the community, by showcasing such strengths, and encouraging ECEs to lean on one another and learn from each other. It would create a stronger sense of community, professionalism, and leadership in the field of ECE. And it would encourage higher standards of quality care, as more people would be aware of each other's centers and programs.

As most centers have an "open door policy" parents and families are aware of what is happening in the programs that their children are attending. Through various forms of communication, centers will make parents aware of the programs they are running, and the importance of such programs to the children's development. Parents will see that their children are benefiting from the quality care – and gaining new knowledge and experiences through the Early Childhood Educators who work with them. Through seeing their children benefit, and through their own positive experiences with the staff and with the centers, parents will realize the value of ECEs work, and this effect will trickle down to the more broad public.

Through reaching out to Early Childhood Professionals in the named community, we hope to enhance the existing Early Childhood programs. We hope to promote the importance of ECEs and their work, as well as create a stronger community, and healthier children and families.
